1	1	Alfred Allen	Furniture maker, born in North Carolina in 1825. Married to Nancy Workman in 1845. Moved to Kansas after the Civil War. Moved to Friendswood in 1897. Father of Mary Jane Brown (Wife of Frank J Brown).
1	1	Solomon Allen	Son of Alfred and Nancy Allen. Moved to Friendswood with his parents in 1897. His wife, Marie, had died in 1889. Solomon, a skilled carpenter, built the desks for the first Friendswood schoolhouse.
1	25	Isaiah Cox	Born in 1833. He and his wife Jane came to Friendswood by covered wagon before the Friendswood tract had been surveyed. Became the first family in Friendswood to live in their own house.
1	32	Newton Knode	Died at the age of 22 in 1895, the result of a tree felling accident. First person to be buried in the Friends cemetery.
2	1	David Harvey	David and his wife Hannah Jane (Stout) moved to Friendswood from Kansas in 1896. Very supportive of the school, church, and community. Hannah was related to the Allen family.
2	1	Nereus Stout	Nereus (born in 1849) and his wife Sarah moved from Kansas with the David Harvey family in 1896. Pioneered in bringing new crops to the area. Known as the "Father of the Fig Industry in South Texas."
2	9	Cyrus Hadley	Cyrus (born in 1857) and his wife Elvira moved to Friendswood from Kansas in 1907. Started the first general merchandise store in Friendswood.
3	1	Francis (Frank) J. Brown	A principal founder (along with the Lewis family) of Friendswood. Moved to the Friendswood area from Kansas in 1894. Former Indian fighter and buffalo hunter. Became a Christian during a revival in 1875. Married Mary Jane Allen in October 1876.
3	1	Cecil Brown	Son of Frank and Mary Jane Brown, born in 1893. Married Frances Perry in 1917. Started the Cecil Brown Fig Co. in 1924 and the Brown Investment Co. (the oldest continuous business in Friendswood) in 1958.
3	2	Edith McGinnis	Daughter of Frank and Mary Jane Brown, born in 1886. Wife of Wade McGinnis. Authored <u>The Promised Land</u> , a collection of stories about her father. Also authored <u>I Remember</u> .
3	5	Zue Bales	Born Myra Zue Stevenson in 1889 in Missouri. Married Edward Bales in 1906. Served as a missionary primarily in Mexico; also in Guatemala and to the Indians near Albuquerque, NM. Zue Bales Intermediate School is named for her.

3	9	Allen (Allie) W. Brown	Son of Frank and Mary Jane Brown, born in 1893. Married Zora Davis in 1914. Farmer, rancher, dairyman in West Friendswood.
4	1	Wesley Allen	Son of Alfred and Nancy Allen. Born in 1847. He and his wife Agnes Lucindy, a niece of Frank Brown, came to Friendswood by covered wagon in 1895. They were the sixth family to move to Friendswood after the land was surveyed.
4	4	Mary Thistlethwaite Baker	Appointed in 1916 as the Friends pastor. The following year, she retained at the first specified salary for a pastor -- \$300.00 per year.
4	5	Nathan Perry	Nathan and his wife Mary came to Friendswood in 1901 as the first called pastors for the Friends Church. They built their house using lumber from trees felled by the 1900 Galveston hurricane. The restored house is located directly behind the Church and is open on Saturday mornings for visitors.
4	6	Jessie E. Miles	Born in 1855. Moved to Friendswood with his daughter Emma in 1898. Was an expert carpenter and cabinetmaker and a talented farmer. Was head carpenter for building the Academy.
